Camp JumpStart Closes the Gap of Summer Reading Loss

All school age children experience learning losses when they don't engage in educational activities during the summer. According to Reading is Fundamental, students lose approximately 2.6 months of grade level equivalency on average in

mathematical computation skills over the summer months.

Research demonstrates that low-income youth experience greater summer learning losses than their higher-income peers, and that low-income students experience cumulative summer learning losses over the elementary school grades.

Agape is closing the gap of summer reading loss by providing Camp JumpStart, a summer reading program for rising 1st and 2nd graders.

Summer of 2014 marks the third year of Camp
JumpStart. This camp was started by members of St.
Anne's Episcopal Church to address the problem of summer reading loss. Agape partners with St. Anne's, the Educational Advisory
Foundation, and the
National Charity
League—Buckhead
Chapter (NCL) to provide this camp for children in our community.

Camp JumpStart, which serves 30 boys and girls from July 14-25, offers a variety of activities. Each day, each child signs out a book and partners up with a reading volunteer. There are science activities, art projects, and tests for grade level proficiency. The kids also learn to cook! The children prepare their own lunches while learning about good nutrition and food handling.

This year, through our partnership with NCL, there is a new addition to Camp JumpStart. For the six weeks leading up to the camp, there is a 2 hour reading session every Wednesday from 10am to noon at Agape! These summer initiatives will greatly enhance Agape's ability to keep our kids on grade level and advance their reading skills.
